- The buying and selling of horses, as well as receiving prize money in cash, are not forbidden providing they do not constitute the competitor's mainly source of income.
- Athletes participating in the CSI Amateurs may not start in any other international competition of the event.
- Holding the "Amateur Owner" status, athletes are not barred from other competitions or Championships. As long as the athlete holds the "Amateur Owner" status, he/she will not be allowed to take part in international or national initial competitions with a height of 1.50 m or greater.

This amount includes the transport of one qualified horse, the equipment and the journey of the groom. This sum covers all the OC's obligations for the journey of the horse to and from Leipzig. The OC's transport agent (Peden Bloodstock) will be at disposal to answer any question concerning the importation or exportation of the horses. The horses may arrive on Saturday 23/04/2011 as of 3.00 p. m.. The Committee shall not bear any additional costs resulting from dispatch,

which does not conform to these instructions.

The Committee shall not take out any insurance for the transport of the horses and person as accompanying them, its liability shall not, in any event, exceed that of the transport contractor being used. If, in case of accident, illness of an animal or bad road conditions, the Committee is called upon to hire transport at the request of and on behalf of the competitors, it shall in no case assume liability in case of accident, and this without recourse either against the transporter himself or the Committee; the handling of loading and uploading, moreover, devolves upon the grooms themselves and involves their own responsibility.

2. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ENTRY OF HORSES

Every Athlete is supplied to deliver all necessary certificates of health for the transport to the event or identification o the horses before they come into the stables:

- a) in case of arrival from a EU-member-country, a certificate for registered horses acc. to sample of Annex B to Reglements 90/426 of the actual valid form will be necessary.
- b) in case of arrival from a country not concerning to the EU, a certificate of health for registered horses acc. to sample of annex II of the decision of the commission 92/260 of the actual valid from will be necessary.

A certificate must be done in at least one official language of the country of destination and in one official language of the member country. The Athlete must carry with him the original certificate, not a copy.

Every Horse entered for any Competition at CNs or CIMs (see Appendix E) and in CSI-P and CSI-Ch-A in a country other than the country of the Horse's nationality, and all Horses entered for other CIs, CIOs, FEI Championships, Regional, Olympic Games and Paralympic Games, whether at home or away from the country of its nationality (see Article 139.2), must have an official, valid FEI passport, or a national passport approved by the FEI and accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card and, when applicable, must be registered with the FEI, as a means of identification and to establish ownership.

2. Horses taking part in CNs and CIMs (see Appendix E) and in CSI-P and CSI-Ch-A in their country of nationality are not required to have such a passport as is mentioned in paragraph 1. All such Horses must be properly registered with the FEI and identifiable and, unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin all Horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION, VET. REGS. ANNEX VI

(except events taking place in NZL & AUS)

From 1 January 2005 onwards, influenza vaccination for all horses competing in FEI competitions requires a vaccination within six months + 21 days of the competition.

1. All horses intending to participate in FEI competition must have at least received an initial primary course of two vaccinations, given between 21 and 92 days apart. Thereafter, a third dose (referred to as the first booster) must be given within 7 months after the date of administration of the second primary dose, with at least annual boosters given subsequently

(i.e. within one year of the last dose).

2. If the horse is scheduled to take part in an FEI competition, the last booster must have been given within 6 months + 21 days of arrival at the FEI event. (The 21-day window has been provided to enable vaccination requirements to fit in with the competition schedule).

3. No vaccination shall be given within 7 days of the day of arrival at the FEI event.

4. All horses that were certified as correctly vaccinated under the previous FEI equine influenza vaccination rule prior to 1st January 2005, do not need to start a primary course again provided that they have complied with the previous rule of primary course and annual re-vaccinations and the new rule of a booster vaccination within 6 months + 21 days of the day of arrival at the FEI event.

SAMPLING FOR PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES

Regular sampling is carried out in CCI3*/4*, CSIs (3*, 4*, 5*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CIs sampling is recommended. When testing takes place, the number of horses tested is at the discretion of the Testing Veterinarian/Veterinary Delegate. At CCI3* and CCI4*, CSIs (3*, 4*, 5*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Cup Finals, Championships and Games it is recommended that a minimum of 5% of all horses (with a minimum of 3 horses tested) must be sampled (see also VR Art. 1016.5.).

Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI Medication Control Programme (Groups I & II only).

MEDICATION CONTROL PROGRAMME (GROUP I & II ONLY)

The Organising Committees of FEI events within Groups I & II are advised to charge Athletes the equivalent of CHF 12.50 per horse per event as a contribution towards the costs of the MCP programme.

X. MISCELLANEOUS

1. PROTESTS

All protests to be valid must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150.- or equivalent.

2. GENERAL CLASSIFICATION AT THE END OF THE COMPETITIONS

Special rating acc. to announcements during the event and information in the Athlete's folder.



3. PRIZE GIVING CEREMONY

Athletes are asked to be prepared to take part in a parade without horse during the opening and/or closing ceremony.

Provided it will not be announced otherwise, the Athletes placed 1st to 8th (CSI-W/CSI3*/CSIYH1*/CSI2* (16-26)), 1st to 3rd (CSI Am A+B) have to attend the respective prize giving ceremony with their horses in accurate riding dress. Not attending the ceremony without valid excuse will entail disqualification.

The owner of the winning horse of the overall rating of the CSI-W Final and of the CSI3* Grand Prix (comp. 9) will be invited to the prize-giving ceremony.

4. DEDUCTIONS FROM PRIZE MONEY

All prize money and all prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money as well as reimbursements (e. g. transport charges, travelling expenses) will be distributed acc. to FEI-RG Art. 127/128 following the last competition at the latest. The scheduled prizes are gross amounts.

Settlement will be done per Athlete. Depending on the agreement with the horse owner, each Athlete binds himself to pass on to the horse owners the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money. The organizer is allowed to deduct possibly outstanding debts of the Athlete. Acc. to § 50a EstG this also applies to foreign horse owners. After having deducted the VAT from the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money, as a rule the following income tax will be due: no taxes up to 250 EUR, 15 % exceeding 250 EUR (in force as of 01.01.2009); plus solidarity fee (at present 5.5 %) of the income amount. Travelling expenses being taken over or reimbursed are only regarded as revenues if they exceed the actual costs and the reimbursement for additional meal allowances acc. to § 4 Abs. 5 Satz 1 Nr. 5 EstG.

The tax deduction has to be certified on demand. Those foreign Athlete being exempted from tax deduction are kindly asked to submit an exemption certificate either with the entry or on the first show day at the latest. Every Athlete himself is responsible for the correctness of the details he submits.

Should the final settlement of accounts show a credit balance, the respective amount will be settled by a cheque.

Should the final settlement of accounts show a debit, the respective amount has to be paid in the show office in cash in EURO. Foreign currencies will be accepted at the conversion rate available in the show office. Athletes from foreign countries in which the EURO is the official currency, cheques will be accepted. Cheques in other currencies cannot be accepted. All bank charges will be at the expense of the Athlete.

5. INSURANCES

All owners and athletes are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

6. LIABILITY

The organizer declines any liability for property or pecuniary damage which may happen to visitors, athletes, grooms and horse owners through slight negligence of the organizer, his delegates or his assistants. The OC is liable in case of intent, gross negligence as well as in case of injury to life, body or health and in further cases he is liable for compelling legal liability acc. to the legal requirements. Furthermore he also declines any liability for theft or other incidents.

7. EVENT'S ORGANISATION

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of the Delegate of the NF GER and Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matter or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all Athletes and officials as soon as possible and must be reported to the FEI Jumping by the Foreign Judge.

In special circumstances (i. e. outbreak of FMD etc.) the OC reserves the right, to cancel or to break off the event in agreement with the FEI and the NF GER.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
